LEGISLATOR MAIO PROMOTES LAW ENFORCEMENT APPRECIATION DAY JANUARY 9, 2018

Maio will deliver her personal message of appreciation to the Ulster County Police Chiefs Association where she is invited to speak at 10:00 am on January 3rd at the Ulster County Law Enforcement Center in Kingston.

- Decorate with blue ribbons and blue balloons

- Share a story about a positive law enforcement experience on social media and/or like their facebook pages
- Send a card of support to your local police department or state agency
- Ask children to write letters or draw pictures in support of law enforcement
- Participate in Project Blue Light proudly displaying a blue light to show your support for law enforcement.

"Most importantly," said Maio, "if you see a police officer, say thank you for their service - not just on January 9th, but every day of the year."
