WHEREAS, the Legislature has determined that reporting criteria would be valuable in determining future Economic Development funding levels; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Ulster County Legislature will require reporting from the Office of Economic Development every other month, on the following areas in order to create a baseline by which to measure the County's economic development efforts:

- Median Wages
- Start-up Job Creation
- Home Sales
- Housing Starts
- County Property Tax Levy
- Sales Tax
- Occupancy "Bed" Tax

- Census Data;
