

**Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute A Lease With Wallkill Body Shop And Glass, Inc., For Space To Be Used As A Substation Of The Ulster County Sheriff's Office – Department Of Public Works (Buildings And Grounds)**

Referred to: The Public Works and Capital Projects Committee (Chairman Fabiano and Legislators Briggs, Maloney, Parete and Roberts), The Law Enforcement and Public Safety Committee (Chairman Parete and Legislators Belfiglio, Briggs, Maio and Ronk), and The Ways and Means Committee (Chairman Gerentine and Legislators Gregorius, Maio, Maloney, Provenzano, Rodriguez and Ronk)

Chairman of the Public Works and Capital Projects Committee, Dean J. Fabiano, and Deputy Chairman John Parete offer the following:

WHEREAS, this resolution has been submitted by the County Executive on behalf of the Department of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, the County currently leases office space located at 3063 Route 208, Wallkill, New York, from Wallkill Body Shop and Glass, Inc. for use as an Ulster County Sheriff's Office substation; and

WHEREAS, the present lease for the Wallkill substation will expire on December 31, 2013; and

WHEREAS, a new lease agreement has been requested by the Ulster County Sheriff in order to continue to operate the Wallkill substation; and

WHEREAS, said lease will be for a term of two years commencing January 1, 2014 and ending December 31, 2015, at an annual rent of \$6,600.00 for the term of the lease, with the cost of all utilities included in the aforementioned annual amount; and

WHEREAS, in any event the tenant, the County of Ulster, shall have the option to terminate the lease for any reason or for no reason, upon sixty (60) days written notice to the landlord; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Ulster County Legislature is hereby authorized to enter into a lease with Wallkill Body Shop and Glass, Inc., for office space located at 3063 Route 208, Wallkill, New York, to be used as a substation of the Ulster County Sheriff's Office, in the form as filed with the Clerk of the Ulster County Legislature or as modified and approved by the County Attorney,

and moves its adoption.
