

Resolution No. 403 July 16, 2024

Authorizing The County Of Ulster To Dedicate County Road 5, Also Known As Hurley Mountain Road, Partially Located In The Town Of Hurley, In Honor Of All Ulster County Gold Star Families, Past And Present

Chair of the Public Works, Capital Projects and Transportation Committee, Kathy Nolan, and Deputy Chair Herbert Litts, III offer the following:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 370 dated October 21, 2014, the Ulster County Legislature established a policy for the naming of county-owned assets; and

WHEREAS, part of County Road 5, also known as Hurley Mountain Road, partially located in the Town of Hurley, is a county-owned asset; and

WHEREAS, on March 26, 2024 the Town Board of the Town of Hurley unanimously adopted a resolution supporting the County of Ulster's intention to dedicate the above mentioned road in honor of Gold Star Families; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the policy for naming of county-owned assets, a public hearing was held on Tuesday, June 18, 2024 at 7:20 PM in the Legislative Chambers, Ulster County Office Building, 6th Floor, 244 Fair Street, Kingston, New York, to ensure public input on the matter was considered; and

WHEREAS, being a Gold Star Family is designation no one wants, they should be honored and remembered for the sacrifices made for the nation; and

WHEREAS, this is an opportunity to pay homage to the County Residents who lost an immediate family member in service to their nation during a time of conflict; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that County Road Number 5, also known as Hurley Mountain Road, partially located in the Town of Hurley, shall be dedicated as "Ulster County Gold Star Families Memorial Highway,"

and move its adoption.
