WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 370 dated October 21, 2014, the Ulster County Legislature established a policy for the naming of county-owned assets; and

WHEREAS, the bridge that spans the Esopus Creek on CR 40 located in the Town of Shandaken is a county-owned asset; and

WHEREAS, on August 6, 2018, the Town Board of the Town of Shandaken unanimously adopted a resolution requesting that the County of Ulster name the above mentioned bridge after former Ulster County Sheriff Michael LaPaglia; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the policy naming county-owned assets, a public hearing was held on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 6:00 PM in the Legislative Chambers, Ulster County Office Building, 6th Floor, 244 Fair Street, Kingston, New York, to insure public input on the matter was considered; and

WHEREAS, Michael LaPaglia served much of his almost 20 year career with the NYPD commuting back and forth from the city to his home in Ulster County; and

WHEREAS, in 1976, Mr. LaPaglia joined the Ulster County Sheriff's Office in the Special Investigation Division where he worked his way up the ranks becoming Lieutenant then Captain; and

WHEREAS, from 1981 – 1986 while living in Shandaken, Michael LaPaglia served as Town Constabulary Administrative Chief and then became Town Councilman; and

WHEREAS, Michael LaPaglia was elected Sheriff of Ulster County in 1986, served a total of three terms, and under his leadership the Ulster County Sheriff's Office achieved accreditation in 1992; and
