**Resolution No. 471** – Urging The New York State Department Of Environmental Conservation To Expedite Actions To Mitigate Contamination From The Hercules Inc/Dyno-Nobel Superfund Site Located In The Town Of Esopus, And Requesting An Update On The Status Of The Revised Proposed Remedial Action Plan

**Resolution Summary** – This Resolution urges the New York State Department of Environment (NYSDEC) to expedite actions to mitigate contamination from the Hercules/Dyno-Nobel Superfund site that have spread beyond their property lines into adjacent properties and past a Kingston Consolidated School District Elementary School, and urges the NYSDEC to move forward with constructing a stormwater retention pond to prevent, and/or significantly reduce spillover of contamination into the Millbrook/Plantasie stream that flows into the Rondout Creek. Moreover, this Resolution requests that an update be submitted to the Clerk of the Ulster County Legislature on the status of the DEC's supplemental investigation, evaluation of results, Feasibility Study, and revised Proposed Remedial Action Plan (PRAP), as reported in the NYSDEC's June 2024 Community Update.
