Legislator Richard A. Parete offers the following:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 332 dated September 15, 2015, the Ulster County Legislature determined that it was responsible to establish a policy regulating the use of Ulster County electric vehicle charging stations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 446 dated December 15, 2015 the Ulster County Legislature determined that it was reasonable and appropriate to charge a fee-for-service for use of the charging stations; and

WHEREAS, in the County Executive's Veto Message of Resolution No. 446, the use of the electric charging stations was referred to repeatedly as a benefit for public purposes; and

WHEREAS, unfortunately, this free benefit could be taken advantage of in the County workplace if the current policy is not modified; and

WHEREAS, Ulster County strives to provide a fair and equitable working environment for all employees; and

WHEREAS, further modification of the Electric Vehicle Charging Policy is required to clarify usage regulations and address enforcement; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the "Ulster County Electric Vehicle Charging Station Policy" is hereby amended as attached hereto as Exhibit A,

and moves its adoption.
