Dear Mr. Litwin,

In May 2023, the Town of Ulster submitted to the County of Ulster a Letter of Intent and an Application requesting Funding from the Ulster County ARPA Sub-Award Program for the construction of a Community Forest Trail System in partnership with Scenic Hudson. This Request was subject to Scenic Hudson obtaining title to the proposed site. Scenic Hudson has not been able to gain control of the site. Therefore, the Town of Ulster is informing the County that we will not be able to accept the Sub-Award for the purpose of constructing the trail system.

The Town of Ulster has identified a substitute project and hereby requests directions on how to proceed, whether through a substitution under the current project approval or a completely new submission.

The Town of Ulster maintains a softball field complex on Orlando Street. One field has stadium lighting for nighttime use. These lights were obtained from the City of Kingston over 40 years ago when Dietz Stadium was last renovated and are inefficient and out of date. In the Spring of 2023 one of the wooden poles supporting the lighting fixtures was blown down and a subsequent inspection of the remaining 5 poles revealed substant rot which requires a complete replacement of the pole. In addition, electrical codes have changed since the initial installation and the electrical system requires upgrading and waterproofing. The initial cost of replacing the lights only was estimated at approximately \$100,000 and was internally funded through a Recreation Reserve Account. Given the identification of additional work items the cost of this project has increased.

The Town of Ulster, through the Town Engineers, Brinnier & Larios PLLC, is in the process of designing the corrective action required and completing a cost estimate. We expect to have these documents within 45 - 60 days.
