Director Litwin explained that the ARP Division's immediate priority is executing contracts for the ARPA Water & Sewer Program. Committee members discussed the communication process, requesting that the ARP Division communicate to all municipalities and businesses that funding has been approved and is pending. Further, Committee members requested communication on municipal project progress. Director Litwin reminded the Committee that the ARP Parks Program applications are out and are due back by April 14th. Additional discussion took place regarding the Mental Health in Schools Programs, the ARP Financial Tracker, and updates on the Crisis Stabilization Center. Legislative Chair Bartels asked Committee members to consider actions which the County cannot otherwise accomplish for the remaining ARPA funding.

Chair Criswell reviewed the ARP Project Tracker, describing the process and the terms utilized. Legislative Chair Bartels suggested considering if any previously approved projects could be funded by another revenue source.

Resolution Summary: This resolution, as presented, establishes Capital Project No. 659 - ARP Solar Infrastructure in the amount of \$3,000,000.00 \$2,500,000.00 to establish a program to match up to 50% of the total cost of a solar infrastructure project with a maximum match of \$125,000.00 \$100,000.00 per project for local municipalities.

Legislator Corcoran explained the proposed amendments to the Resolution, emphasizing how far the funding can go when utilized with other available grants. Chair Criswell reviewed the Committee's scores for the Program. Legislative Chair Bartels confirmed that municipalities will complete a competitive bid process, expressed concern that the County may end up funding a greater sum than a participating municipality, and inquired as to known projects. Further, Legislative Chair Bartels informed the Committee that some municipalities are discouraging homeowners from participating in solar, asking the Committee if it's possible to request that municipalities change their local regulations to incentivize solar as a requirement to participate in the ARPA Solar Infrastructure Program.

Resolution No. 88: Amending The 2023 Budget To Provide Hudson River Watershed Alliance With Funding For Administrative And Program Support Services To Assist Various Agencies In Ulster County - Department Of Finance, Division Of Recovery And Resilience

Resolution Summary: This Resolution amends the 2023 Ulster County Budget for the purpose of providing funding to the Hudson River Watershed Alliance in the amount of \$35,000.00 for a contract to be executed for administrative and programming support on behalf of the RCWA, the WRWA, and the Ulster County Water Quality Committee.

Legislator Stewart acknowledged that the Organization missed the application deadline for this funding stream. Legislative Chair Bartels expressed concern for member-items that don't contain a County-wide outreach and benefit.

Legislative Chair Bartels expressed concern with funding the Project without any properties or programming that is known and ready for further action, emphasizing the amount of authority that is being bestowed within the Resolution. Legislator Sperry expressed interest in knowing that both of the required Respite Houses are included within the scope of the requested funding before proceeding forward. Further discussion pursued on the Project's progress, the Legislative process, and Capital Project No. 598 – Crisis Stabilization Center, which was initially proposed in attachment with the Respite Houses.
