#### PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Chairman Kenneth Ronk granted Privilege of the Floor to Butch Dener. Mr. Dener presented information regarding April as Organ Donor Month. He was joined by Tara Salerno of Kingston, who spoke about her personal experience as an organ donor. Also joining Mr. Dener was Shaina Kaye, Hospital and Community Services Specialist with the Center for Donation and Transplant (CDT), at Albany Medical Center, New York.

Chairman Kenneth Ronk called upon Legislator Craig V. Lopez, Chairman of the Public Health and Social Services Committee and Deputy Chair Legislator Chris Allen, who presented a Proclamation to Butch Dener and Tara Salerno, on behalf of the Ulster County Legislature, declaring the month of April Organ Donor Month.

#### **PRESENTATIONS:**

Chairman Kenneth Ronk called upon District No. 1 Legislator Mary Wawro, District No. 2 Legislator Chris Allen, District No. 22 Legislator John Parete, District No. 23 Legislator Jonathan Heppner, and District No. Legislator Dean Fabiano who presented Ulster County Pride Awards to Shayna Micucci and Kasandra Quednau, co-founders of the Rt. 212 Coalition, in recognition of their efforts to "bridge the gap" in substance abuse services by linking resources, providing support, building awareness, and collaborating with other organizations in Ulster County to make services more accessible to those in need.

Chairman Kenneth Ronk called upon District No. 19 Legislator Manna Jo Greene, District No. 15 Legislator Thomas Briggs, District No. 21 Legislator Ronald Lapp, and District No. 18 Legislator Richard Parete who presented an Ulster County Pride Award to Fern Sarnoff, art teacher at Rondout Valley High School, who has been instrumental in the "EMPTY BOWLS" Project; donating one hundred percent of proceeds to local food pantries. Joining Ms. Sarnoff was her husband Steve Stewart.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

There were (24) speakers signed up for public comment.

- 1. <u>Bob Vosper, Cottekill</u>: Mr. Vosper a retired town justice from Rosendale and a counselor in the prison system for thirty years spoke in support of Marie Shultz and funding increase for the peer driven AWARENESS program.
- 2. <u>Ralph Mitchell</u>: Mr. Mitchell a self-proclaimed economic development activist spoke in favor of the Catskill Mtn. Railroad (CMRR) lease. Mr. Mitchell provided (23) signatures from local businesses strongly requesting county government sign a short term agreement with (CMRR) to continue the successful Polar Express and other featured programs that are very important to their business livelihood.
- 3. <u>Kevin Smith, Bearsville</u>: Mr. Smith is Chairman of the Woodstock Land Conservancy and Cochair of Friends of the Catskill Mountain Rail Trail Committee. Mr. Smith spoke in support of the U&D Corridor.
- 4. <u>Father John Nelson, Woodstock</u>: Father Nelson spoke in support of organ donor month and was pleased with the outpouring of community support. Father Nelson also spoke in strong support of a fully operational railroad with continued and through service to Belleayre Mountain with the anticipation of the Olympics potentially coming to the area, and preserving our railroad heritage.
- 5. <u>Kelly Myers & Anna Myers, Saugerties</u>: Ms. Myers and her daughter who is a girl scout also spoke in favor of the Polar Express and other fun train rides for children, along with its economic impact if extended all the way to Arkville.
- 6. Don Sayut, West Hurley: Mr. Sayut also spoke in support of the railroad.
- 7. <u>Teresa Costa, Hurley</u>: Ms. Costa signed up for public comment but was not available when called upon.
- 8. <u>Karen Vetere, Kingston</u>: Ms. Vetere also spoke in support of the railroad.
- 9. <u>Ryan Lennox</u>, <u>Phoenicia</u>: Mr. Lennox is part of Explore the Catskills movement, who as a volunteer helped clear thirty five of the thirty eight miles of railroad tracks. Mr. Lennox envisions a fully functioning railroad from Kingston to Belleayre Mountain and asked the legislature to reconsider.
- 10. <u>Russ Bonk</u>: Mr. Bonk also spoke in favor of the railroad, return on investment, and preserving our heritage. Mr. Bonk noted Dutchess County is now thinking about putting their once removed rails back on the Harlem Valley rail trail. Mr. Bonk noted there is plenty of room for rail and trail, 66 feet minimum to 150 feet available to work with.

- 11. <u>Ken Anello, Shandaken</u>: Mr. Anello who is a business owner in Shandaken read a letter on behalf of other business owners asking the members of the finance committee, county legislators and Executive Hein to renew the railroad lease that is set to expire on May 31, 2016. Mr. Anello provided the clerk with fifty signatures including comments from local businesses for the record.
- 12. <u>Dakim Morehouse</u>, <u>Phoenicia</u>: Mr. Morehouse also a business owner spoke in favor of saving the railroad. Mr. Morehouse clarified the Catskill Mtn. Railroad and the Empire State Railway Museum is independent and separate organizations.
- 13. <u>Kathy Nolan, Shandaken</u>: Ms. Nolan conveyed the recent growth numbers of tourism in the Catskills and the Hudson Valley are mostly due to outdoor recreation.
- 14. <u>Merle Borenstein, Kingston</u>: Ms. Borenstein provided the clerk with over one thousand signatures from Ulster County residents voicing their strong support for the previously proposed Ulster County law that would establish standards of care and periodic inspections of the facilities of dog breeders who operate within Ulster County.
- 15. <u>Lucy Muller, Cragsmoor</u>: Ms. Muller also spoke in support of dog breeder inspections in Ulster County. Ms. Muller noted every signature listed was heartfelt.
- 16. <u>John Michelotti</u>, <u>Big Indian</u>: Six generations of Mr. Micholotti's family have enjoyed life in Big Indian. Mr. Micholotti spoke in support of the railroad, noting there are not enough jobs for our young people to remain in the community.
- 17. <u>Pat Valusek, Port Ewen</u>: Ms. Valusek is the President of the New York State Humane Association who spoke in support of dog breeder inspections in Ulster County.
- 18. <u>Mark A. Klonfas, New Paltz</u>: Mr. Klonfas has been a resident of Ulster County all his life. Mr. Klonfas spoke in support of the railroad and asked the legislature to view the railroad as a mode of transportation and not a novelty.
- 19. <u>Adam Saunders, Kingston</u>: Mr. Saunders is the Executive Director of the Ulster County SPCA. Mr. Saunders spoke in support of passing the once proposed Pet Seller Law legislation.
- 20. <u>Christina Gardner, Boiceville</u>: Ms. Gardner is the daughter of once Ulster County Chairman Ernie Gardner, who originally started the railroad revival by asking for a feasibility study to be done in 1977 and was resolute on buying the railroad. Ms. Gardner noted the railroad over the years has brought much joy to many families and expressed rail and train can both be realized.
- 21. <u>Heidi Lennox</u>, <u>Phoenicia</u>: Ms. Lennox spoke in favor of both rail and trail but railroad always first. Ms. Lennox is hoping for a state wide effort to create a local railroad preservation society to preserve our rich history. Ms. Lennox compared saving the railroads started in 1870 as to saving historical NYC buildings over the years.

- 22. <u>Frank Nazzaro, Kingston</u>: Mr. Nazzaro a volunteer and supporter of the railroad for over thirty five years spoke in support of the railroad. Mr. Nazzaro noted he is an organ donor and a pet owner.
- 23. <u>Mike Wendel</u>, <u>Wawarsing</u>: Mr. Wendel spoke in support of saving the railroad. Mr. Wendel noted his experience within county government.
