PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Vice Chairman David B. Donaldson granted Privilege of the Floor to District No. 12 Legislator Kevin Roberts, who introduced Mr. Denis Murphy, founder of the "Friends of Jaclyn Foundation". The foundation aims to improve the quality of life for children battling pediatric brain tumors and other childhood cancers by pairing them with local high school and college sports teams.

PRESENTATIONS: There were no presentations for tonight's meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT: There was (7) speakers signed up for Public Comment.

1. <u>Margaret Rhoda, Kingston</u>: Ms. Rhoda is employed as a Registered Nurse at Health Alliance Hospital, Kingston, NY. Ms. Rhoda spoke in support of Memorializing Resolution No. 299, Supporting The Passage Of The Safe Staffing for Quality Care Act.

- 2. <u>Lenny Distel, Supervisor of Wawarsing</u>: Supervisor Distel spoke in support of Resolution No. 314, Approving The Execution Of A Contract Between The County Of Ulster And The UC Economic Development Alliance To Implement The Recommendations Of The Ellenville Million Committee. Supervisor Distel noted they still have high hopes for the redevelopment of the 540 acres of the Nevele property as well.
- 3. Tom Delaney, Saugerties: Mr. Delaney who previously spoke at the August 12, 2015 Public Hearing regarding Proposed Local Law No. 12 of 2015, For The Regulation of Pet Sellers. Mr. Delaney supports the proposed law however made the request to send the proposed law back to the Laws & Rules Committee to resolve the following issues: housing standards inconsistencies and deficiencies, enforcement conflicts of interest, onerous veterinary and documentation standards for small breeders, inappropriate warranty definitions and potential legal complications. Mr. Delaney for the record provided the Clerk with literature outlining his concerns.
- 4. <u>Ed Noll, Saugerties, NY</u>: Mr. Noll has been a breeder of Labrador retriever's for 25 years. Mr. Noll also spoke to the same concerns as the previous speaker Mr. Delaney noting the proposed law ties their hands, whereas they can't meet all of the requirements and the law conflicts with state regulations.
- 5. <u>Cynthia Werthamer, Saugerties, NY</u>: Ms. Werthamer also spoke regarding the regulation for pet sellers, noting there's a difference between breeders that are experts in the field vs. back yard breeders. Ms. Werthamer also asked that they be a part of the process crafting legislation and also spoke to Mr. Delaney's summary sheet on file with the Clerk of the Legislature.
- 6. <u>Lynda B. Doughty, Saugerties, NY</u>: Although Ms. Doughty signed up for public comment, she choose not to speak when called upon.
- 7. <u>Melissa Fairweather</u>: Ms. Fairweather is a breader of Golden retriever's who echoed the previous speakers sentiments noting she was pleased the legislation will be going back to committee for further review.
