Proposed Local Law No. 14 of 2015 (A Local Law Prohibiting The Sale Of Personal Care Products Containing Microbeads In Ulster County)

PUBLIC COMMENT: There were (9) nine speakers signed up for the 1st public hearing comment period of which (7) seven spoke.

- 1. <u>John A. Hurson, Personal Care Products Council</u> Mr. Hurson is the Executive Vice President of Government Affairs for the Personal Care Products Council who represents cosmetics companies in the United States and internationally. Mr. Hurson spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law No. 14 of 2015 and urged the legislature to implement legislation that is consistent with legislation that has been adopted around the country and in six other counties in New York State. Mr. Hurson stated the legislation must clearly define what a plastic micro-bead is, as it might affect other products that don't have micro-beads and create confusion as to what needs to be reformulated.
- 2. <u>Jennifer Nalbone</u>, <u>Environmental Scientist</u> Ms. Nalbone is an environmental scientist for the Office of the Attorney General Eric Schneiderman, who spoke on behalf of AG Schneiderman's office. Ms. Nalbone spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law 14 of 2015 noting, seventy four percent of polythene beads used in personal care products pass through waste water treatment plants and into our waters and food chain.
- 3. <u>Patrick Landewe</u>, <u>Saugerties</u> Mr. Landewe is the Saugerties Lighthouse Keeper and Village Trustee who serves on the waterfront committee, also spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law 14 of 2015.
- 4. <u>Steve Rosario</u>, <u>American Council</u> Mr. Rosairo is a Hudson Valley resident and is a chemist representing the American Council also spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law 14 of 2015. He noted the chemistry of products changes the definition of each product which makes it difficult to apply the law. He supports the need to create an exact definition of what a micro-bead is.
- 5. <u>Karen Markiseuis</u> Although Ms. Markiseuis signed up for public comment, she was not in attendance when called upon.

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- 6. <u>Kathy Nolan</u> Ms. Nolan supports Proposed Local Law No. 14 of 2015 stating toxins adhere to the micro-beads and work their way through the food chain. Also Ms. Nolan noted some products may cause gingivitis of the gums.
- 7. <u>Kate Hudson Riverkeeper</u> Ms. Hudson also spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law No. 14 of 2015. Although the NYS Assembly has passed legislation it remains to be seen how the Senate will receive the legislation. Ms. Hudson also noted microbeads have been in the water system for the past 10-15 years.
- 8. Mary McNamara, Village of Saugerties Ms. McNamara also spoke in favor of Proposed Local Law No. 14 of 2015. Ms. McNamara stated Ulster County has been a leader of the environment and has the responsibility of the New York City and Westchester County drinking water.
- 9. <u>Layla Cummings</u> Although Ms. Cummings signed up for public comment, she was not in attendance when called upon.

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PUBLIC COMMENT: There were (4) four speakers signed up for the 1st public hearing comment period.

- 1. <u>Leonard Distel, Wawarsing Supervisor</u> Mr. Distel is a former Ulster County Legislator who agrees with the proposed salary revisions however would like the insurance coverage be eliminated after ten years. Mr. Distel noted tax payers can't afford their own taxes let alone pay for other people.
- 2. <u>Mike Dovich, Marlboro</u>: Mr. Dovich spoke against Proposed Local Law No. 19 of 2015 however qualified he's not necessarily opposed to a raise but more the timing right after an election.
- 3. <u>Tom Mearlial</u> Mr. Mearlial is opposed to Proposed Local Law No. 19 of 2015 as residents are being forced out of their homes due to the cost of living. Mr. Mearlial also disagrees a raise would attract people to run for office. The tax payers don't deserve the increase in cost of living.
- 4. <u>Glenn Noonan</u> Mr. Noonan is a former Ulster County Legislator and current Chair of the Ulster County Periodic Compensation Review Committee whose committee was charged with making recommendations to the Legislature regarding Proposed Local Law No. 19 of 2015. Mr. Noonan thanked his committee noting they met nine times over a period of five months formulating their recommendations for the Legislature. Mr. Noonan was disappointed the legislature disregarded the recommendations of the committee.
