Suzanne Holt- Quarterly Update

Update on film Industry: The film industry has been a priority in Kingston. There have been three events with film. The first event was how to make your town film friendly. The second event was for all businesses that wanted to be in the film industry. The last event which is scheduled for May 5th is to have the people who live and work in Ulster County to collaborate with the movie industry at the Hudson Valley Maritime Museum.

Update on Tech: The County has been working with Grand Central Tech out of NYC, and they receive thousands of applications of Tech start up companies and only chose 20 to work with.

Grand Central Tech was looking to branch out north of NYC and they met with Dennis Crowley and he showed them around Kingston. Tech North, as they call themselves, have asked the UCEDA to sponsor them for the months of July and August at the Senate Garage. Tech North will work here and will stay in our hotels or air B&B's and then these individuals will go back to talk about our community.

Luminary Ad Agency update: The County will be doing events and one such event will be going to the Grand Central Tech and publicizing our County.

Suzanne also stated the 2^{nd} annual Food and Beverage event was held recently and it went well with 80 - 100 people that attended.

Legislator Rodriguez suggested sticking with the process.

Legislator Maloney asked the question if twenty minutes would be enough time to vote. Legislator Archer stated that would not be enough time. Legislator Maloney agreed and stated the resolutions might need to be pushed to June or have a special meeting towards the middle or end of May before session. Legislator Archer agreed and stated that might have to be done if twenty minutes is not enough time to make a decision.

Legislator Maio stated the committee members should come with their three lowest votes.

Legislator Rodriguez would like to add the names of Legislator Lynn Archer and Legislator Brian Woltman to be interviewed before going into Executive Session.

Legislator Rodriguez confirmed with Legislator Nolan he would like these candidates to be legislative representatives. Legislator Rodriguez stated the IDA in the past has had legislators serve on the IDA Board. Mike Berardi served on the board for four years. Currently there are two on the Sullivan County IDA board.

Legislator Maloney and Legislator Maio stated they wished they knew about the candidates. Legislator Rodriguez stated it was discussed very quickly.

Legislator Maio stated she did not want to discuss this topic now in order to keep with the current schedule of interviewing appointments.

Legislator Rodriguez stated he wanted to mention the appointments in advance before going into Executive Session.

(After exiting Executive Session)

Legislator Rodriguez suggested calling the question on Resolutions 164 -170. Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maloney stated Legislator Archer stated a week ago that the committee would put forth their bottom three and there was no notification of these two candidates.

Legislator Rodriguez stated that is why he mentioned their names prior to Executive Session. Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maio asked what were the guidelines.

Legislator Nolan asked if there was a time frame to submit resumes and Legislator Maloney stated yes there was a time frame.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maio asked Legislator Rodriguez if he was suggesting two out of the seven members be legislators be on the board.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Archer stated the committee has set direction with the IDA and the legislative body should be informed of what happens with the IDA and be a part of the process. Currently legislators sit on the UCEDA and there is no representation on the IDA.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maloney stated the reason the IDA was created was to have five or seven independent people that are free of political influence.

Legislator Archer stated we have board members in politics.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Archer stated that maybe there should be a rule nobody who is currently sitting on any town board should be on the IDA.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maio asked if there was IDA information on how to structure the board and Legislator Rodriguez confirmed yes.

Legislator Woltman stated having participation of legislators on the IDA could be beneficial.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Nolan stated it could be beneficial to have legislators but the question is if it is reasonable to have a legislator interview after being a part of the interview process.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Maloney stated this decision-making process will be pushed into June. Twenty minutes next Tuesday will not be enough time.

Legislator Maio stated if we choose to change the interview process for the next round that is fine but currently the process was to interview and appoint seven people.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Archer stated that Legislator Maio suggested to come in with bottom three.

Legislator Rodriguez stated in the past when a legislator was on the IDA it was very useful and he is very comfortable with the idea.

Legislator Maloney stated he would confirm information with Legislative Counsel and the County Attorney if legislators can be on the board.

Discussion ensued.

Legislator Rodriguez stated we will meet next week.

Legislator Maloney stated there will be a fifteen or twenty-minute meeting and to bring in the bottom three to be tallied. If there is a consensus the names will be placed on the resolutions. Legislator Archer apologized but the new scenario just evolved.

Resolution Summary: This resolution approves the execution of a contract with United Way of Ulster County Inc. in the amount of \$234,715.00 for summer youth employment program payroll services.

Discussion:

Lisa Berger stated this program is done every year. The funds come through the OTDA. To qualify for this program the family must be at or below 200% poverty level, or receives public assistance or the youth themselves receives the SSI. This program is very successful. Unfortunately,

this year applications have been trickling in due to the minimum wage increase. The Department of Employment and Training would like to increase the hourly rate from \$10.40 an hour to \$11.00 an hour.

Lisa Berger provided a hand out of businesses who employ these individuals. The applications that are received are reviewed as well as the towns work sites who offer employment.

Lisa confirmed with Legislator Archer these jobs average a work week of 28 hours but can work up to 40 hours a week. In addition, OTDA pays these employees. United Way places these individuals on their payroll and then the county contracts with United Way. United Way then pays the employees and United Way picks up the individual's workers comp and unemployment.

Most of the people in the program are from the City of Kingston. Department of Training does ask the businesses if there is a problem or difficulty at the worksite that they are contacted to evaluate the situation. The age range is 16 to 20 years old.

Legislator Rodriguez asked how heavily weighted towards Kingston are these job placements. While Legislator Rodriguez understands that eligibility is part of the consideration there are 74 youths in Kingston and only 5 youths in New Paltz.

Lisa Berger stated they have worked very hard within New Paltz handing flyers out to Jim Tinger, the high school, churches, synagogues and have broadly let people become aware of the program. Legislator Rodriguez would be willing to pass out handouts to Meadow Brook Circle and Colonial Drive but is concerned about the disparity of numbers between eligible youth in Kingston versus New Paltz. Lisa Berger stated there are great work sites in New Paltz and she has not been able to fill them.

Legislator Archer stated the percentage of kids below the poverty line in New Paltz is something else to consider. Legislator Rodriguez stated he is referencing the entirety of the eligibility as a whole and targeting the less affluent areas.

Poverty percentage is based off the census district the individuals reside in.

Legislator Archer stated if there is a need for assistance she would look at some of the small business in her community. Ken Crannel also stated to keep in mind the number of kids that live in particular areas.

Legislator Maloney confirmed this contract is 100% federally funded.

Lisa Berger also mentioned there will be a veteran's job fair next week.
