- Proposed Plastic Bag Legislation Chairman Parete reported that Legislator Bartels was
 preparing a draft resolution for discussion and intends to give time and thought to the input of
 other legislators and concerned citizens
- Climate Smart Committee Legislator Greene reported a great deal of interest in electrical vehicles and charging station. She outlined some of the issues the CSC would focus on in 2017 that included monitoring the Family Court move to the BRC and ensuring environmental improvements were included. She described progress on street lighting consortiums that will assist smaller municipalities make the conversion to LED lighting. She anticipated some new members from the Towns of Olive and Rochester. She reported much interest in NYS Reforming the Energy (REV) program and various solar projects.

Legislator Greene spoke about a challenge to the US Coast Guard's proposed Hudson River anchorages that described the fact that the USCG did not follow their own protocol and procedures in making the proposal.

Legislator Greene asked the comptroller's office to calculate what Ulster County government will pay toward the nuclear subsidies and his estimates that it will be about \$45,000 a year.

The committee had a brief discussion about Central Hudson charges and the new billing cycle.

• Solid Waste Management Improvement Commission - Legislator Greene reported the commission is still working on the report.
