PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Chairman John R. Parete granted Privilege of the Floor to Duane Postupack representing Congressman Chris Gibson, who discussed the collective efforts to maintain a Social Security Office in Ulster County. A letter from Congressman Chris Gibson, read by Duane Postupack, is on file with the Clerk of the Legislature.

PUBLIC COMMENT: There were five (5) speakers at tonight's meeting.

1. Lynda Boryk:

Ms. Boryk stated she is an employee of the Lake Katrine Social Security Office and noted the hardships that would be created if the local office was closed. She highlighted the alternative suggest by Senator Schumer to relocate the office. (Written comment on file with Clerk of the Legislature.)

2. Ann Papelian:

Ms. Papelian stated she was employed at the Lake Katrine Social Security Office for 37 ½ years. She spoke in support of keeping the local Social Security Office open. Ms. Papelian indicated that Ulster County had the same area comparison as the State of Rhode Island, which had five offices whereas Ulster County only maintained one office.

3. Peter Fluchere:

Mr. Fluchere spoke in support of the Catskill Mountain Railroad. (Written comment on file with the Clerk of the Legislature.)

4. Tobe Carey:

Mr. Carey stated he is a resident of Hurley and referenced Daily Freeman article regarding the safety of the oil tankers traveling through Ulster County and the codes presented on the tankers. (Written comment on file with Clerk of the Legislature).

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5. Walter Otto:

Mr. Otto spoke on the topic of the costly litigation that was currently ongoing between the Catskill Mountain Railroad and the County of Ulster.
