Considered to be the first of its kind in the United States, the weekend long festival will focus on mental health issues contributing to suicide and narcotics addiction.

This free, kid friendly event aims to create an environment of empowerment and healing to all who attend. The festival will also include a wide range of activities to attract at risk individuals and their families. In addition to seminars and access to agencies and support, there will be athletic activities, art and film exhibitions, live music, crafters, vendors and food.

Chairman Kenneth Ronk called upon Legislator Mary Wawro, Chairman of the Legislative Programs, Education and Community Services Committee to present a Pride of Ulster County Award to Joseph Defino for his efforts to create an environment accepting of all individuals and promoting a feeling of community.
