Chairman Delaune called the meeting to order at 6:37 PM.

Chairman Delaune asked Dr. Roberts, President- SUNY Ulster to address the committee. Dr. Roberts thanked the legislature for supporting the College's capital projects, with the County's support, in three years the College will be rejuvenated. Legislator Haynes asked how the College got so far behind. Vice President Capuano pointed out that, <u>under the previous</u> administration, there was a misunderstanding of capital procedures, and that these expenses were being taken out of the operating budget.

Dr. Roberts and Vice President Capuano asked to discuss the Dutchess County Community College audit report. Vice President Capuano discussed that Dutchess was drawing down their fund balance, and receiving increased county contributions in order to keep their tuition rate low. It was discussed that Dutchess will be raising their tuition this year.

Chairman Delaune asked what enrollment would look like for SUNY Ulster in the future. Chairman Delaune noted a decrease in birth rate. Dr. Roberts stated that enrollment will decrease. Legislator Donaldson stated that enrollment will be a challenge for all community colleges. Dr. Roberts discussed that the College has done well in regards to enrollment, and has actually managed to grow when almost all other community colleges reported a loss in enrollment. Dr. Roberts added that the College will not be able to continue that trend, and has projected a loss in enrollment. Dr. Roberts stated that SUNY Ulster would be increasing its tuition by four percent. This works out to be about \$100 per semester (for full-time students) or \$10 per credit (for part-time students). It was discussed that the College has not raised tuition in a couple of years. Legislator Donaldson asked Dr. Roberts if the College asked for more money. Dr. Roberts stated that the College did not ask for more money, but asked for other things. Dr. Roberts stated that new computers were purchased as part of the capital projects, and the County is paying for a recruiter for the College. Vice President Capuano pointed out that with the capital projects, the State splits the cost with the County.

Legislator Donaldson asked when the legislature would receive the budget. Dr. Roberts stated that the budget needs to be approved by the Board of Trustees. Once the Board of Trustees approves the budget then it will be forwarded to the legislature. Legislator Donaldson suggested having the budget sent to the Ways and Means Committee as soon as it is approved, so that they can review it before the hearing.

Dr. Roberts shared that he is part of the transition team for the new County Executive. Dr. Roberts stated that he has been working on the team with John Finch and they are working on economic development. Chairman Delaune asked if this is an opportunity for the College. Dr. Roberts stated that he believed it is an opportunity. Dr. Roberts shared that the College has received a workforce training grant from New York State (\$675,000.00) to revamp the Green Building Maintenance program with SUNY Sullivan. This is a career degree in which all the courses relate directly to preparing students for specific careers. Once a student completes the program, they will be awarded an AOS (Associate of Occupational Studies) degree. This will allow the College to draw FTE dollars instead of fees, as these kinds of courses were taught traditionally on fees. Legislator Haynes asked if the College would be doing any green updates as they work through their capital projects. Vice President Capuano stated that the College will be going through an energy audit. Legislator Delaune pointed out that some green improvements might be a good idea being that the College will be getting into that business.
