Legislature Seats Ulster County Industrial Development Agency Board of Directors

KINGSTON, NY—This evening, lawmakers reappointed two former board members and seated five new individuals to serve on the Ulster County Industrial Development Agency (UCIDA) Board of Directors.

Dr. Diane Eynon, University of Pennsylvania, resident of Accord, was reappointed to a second term, and Michael Ham, International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) Local 825, resident of Kingston, was reappointed to a third term on the UCIDA Board of Directors.

New board members include Lynn Archer, licensed realtor and former Ulster County legislator, resident of Accord; Steven L. Kelley, president and chief executive officer of Ellenville Regional Hospital, resident of Highland; Rachel Silverman, Esq., business development consultant and founder of Hub6 LLC, resident of Stone Ridge; Rashida Tyler, associate executive director of outreach and program development at the Ulster County YMCA, resident of Kingston; and Kaustubh Wahal, managing partner at H2C Securities Inc., resident of Kerhonkson.

"The Ulster County Legislature is proud to seat the most diverse board of directors in the agency's history," said Chair Tracey Bartels. "For the first time, four of the seven UCIDA directors are women. Diversity on the board is also expressed through race, gender, age, expertise, and world views on economic and community development."

Legislator Brian Cahill (Towns of Kingston and Ulster, District 4), chair of the Economic Development, Planning, Education, Employment, Arts, and Agriculture Committee (EDPEEAAC), shares, "The selection process for new board members was extensive and far-reaching. We had over 24 applicants for seven positions. The quality and diverse backgrounds of the applicants were extraordinary."

Legislator Thomas Corcoran (Town of Marlborough District 11), EDPEEAAC member, said, "The committee invested extraordinary time in soliciting, interviewing, and selecting the most qualified candidates to represent the best interests of Ulster County." He adds, "Every applicant prepared thoroughly and brought their unique strengths to their interviews."

"Choosing members from such a strong pool of applicants was very difficult," said Cahill. "In the end, the Economic Development Committee unanimously agreed on the seven highly qualified candidates we put forward."

"The committee was inspired to meet so many county residents who want to get involved in economic development and are keen to keep their local communities at the center of future developments," said EDPEEAAC member Legislator Megan Sperry (Towns of Esopus and New Paltz, District 17).



"The educational and business backgrounds of the seven UCIDA board members are mind-blowing," said EDPEEAAC member Chris Hewitt (Town of Rochester, District 21). "I believe the current slate of UCIDA representatives may constitute one of the strongest Industrial Development Agencies in our country."

Legislator Hewitt adds, "The Economic Development Committee invested tremendous time to build a strong candidate pool and rigorous interview process. We can all be proud of the depth of knowledge, passion for our people, and financial acumen of the new UCIDA board."

"The new board is diverse in expertise, philosophies, motivations, and future goals. Each member brings complementary skills to the table," said Legislator Sperry. "Ulster County is changing rapidly; the new board represents the county's future."

"Our legislative committee worked very hard to unanimously select seven highly qualified members," said Legislator Hewitt. "We collaborated in a nonpartisan fashion to find UCIDA directors who will best represent all of the people of Ulster County." Hewitt adds, "The representatives who were selected understand that the future direction of the UCIDA centers on equity and inclusion and making decisions on behalf of the people, not just big business."

UCIDA board members are appointed by the Ulster County Legislature. Board member terms commence on June 1, 2022, and end on December 31, 2023.

Lynn Archer—Accord, NY

Lynn Archer has worked as a licensed realtor for Mary Collins Real Estate, Inc., based in High Falls, NY, for seven years. Archer brings over 20 years of banking and financial experience to the UCIDA board and deep expertise in mortgage banking.
