Okay, great. Thank you so much for your time. My name is Brahvan Ranga. I'm the political coordinator for the many formerly known as Nobody Leaves Mid-Hudson and really appreciate the legislature allowing me to speak at this meeting. I'm here today to speak about the proposed good cause eviction

law. Our organization was founded in 2009 to fight housing injustice in the communities in Ulster County. Every single day we speak with people who face the struggle and constant fears of housing insecurity. And we've spoken to hundreds of residents of Ulster County all across the county, and they have expressed the need for stronger tenant protections and good cause eviction in this community. Right now, tenants live in constant fear. They're afraid that at any moment an arbitrary eviction or an unconscionable rent increase will force them and their family from their home. They're afraid to come forward to ask for better conditions because of how their landlords might respond or retaliate. They're also powerless in their interaction with landlords and have to deal with intimidation or neglect from them because they don't have the tools to fight back. By considering this crucial legislation, the Ulster County legislature is taking a step forward in the fight to affirm fundamental tenant rights by protecting against evictions without adjust cause by protecting against unconscionable rent increases which are essentially the same as an eviction and by protecting against intimidation from the landlord. The Ulster County legislature is affirming these fundamental tenant rights. But beyond just protecting tenants, this bill also rewards good responsible landlords. It incentivizes good behavior, and it removes the unfair market advantage currently exploited by predatory landlords. It also saves Ulster County and the taxpayers that live in the county by reducing the costs required to carry out evictions, as well as the immeasurable costs that come with housing insecurity, which includes services to homeless folks. And finally, and perhaps most importantly, by combating housing insecurity, this law will strengthen the mutual trust and unity within the county and affirm that Ulster County is a beacon of progress and decency in these incredibly turbulent, and uncertain times. Again, I thank the county legislature, particularly Legislator Uchitelle for introducing this legislation. And I applaud your courage in considering this desperately needed law. Thank you again for your time. I really appreciate it.

Chairman Donaldson

Before I call for any comments on this, I'm going to make a comment. I already cleared it with Leader Ronk and Leader Heppner - they are allowing me to speak from here rather than coming down.

Chairman Donaldson

This evening, I will be casting a no vote in protest against the contract for forensic pathology services with Westchester Medical Center. While I understand, it would cost substantially more for the county to contract that same services with another vendor, I cannot agree to give a dime to a corporation that has chosen to dismantle our community's health care delivery system. (Inaudible) part of the pandemic Westchester Medical Center held close to 60 inpatient mental health and detox beds in our hospital to make room for an expected surge in local corona patients. They moved all mental health inpatient care to their Dutchess County Hospital. They told us the transfer would be temporary and that they added comprehensive plan to ensure our community continue to receive vital behavioral health services. No plan materializes, this surge ever occurred and the promises of mental health beds were not returned to Ulster County. It is obviously they never intended to move those beds back to Kingston. They profited from the pandemic by eliminating what they consider less profitable inpatient mental health care and Ulster County, despite their continued calls for these vital services to be returned. In addition, earlier this year, they laid off over 40 hospital staff and claim they were reducing support staff. In reality, they cut supervising nurses putting an extraordinary strain on its remaining nursing staff and are risking patient safety. Recently, they began to cut even more nursing positions. Rather than having compassion and support their trained staff, they show callous disregard. Staff reductions has caused existing nurses to do double shifts. The cafeteria that nurses depend on quick refuel and relax during a break is often closed. Rather than ensuring nurses have support these shortsighted executives risk more than morale, risk public health. Born and raised in Kingston I know firsthand, that is not what our community is about. It is not what Dutchess County I mean Ulster County, does. Health Alliance, Hudson Valley Hospital is destroying our community hospital and creating a healthcare desert in the heart of Ulster County. It's especially true for those with less means for those that can't go elsewhere. My heart goes out to the nurses and other staff tried to deliver the best care they can why the administration they work for seem to be doing the opposite. I believe is the continued effort to send patients to other hospitals and reduce our community on to an intake stop. We must exert every imaginable legal moral and monetary pressure that we can to bring back the quality here and the respectability of our community hospital we once had. So, as I said, I will be voting no, something that I usually never do for protest vote. Because I know it's a dangerous thing to do sometimes, but I will. Thank you. On the issue, Legislator Ronk.

Legislator Ronk

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. You know, I was just gonna say a lot more than I'm going to say. But I think that you've said it all, too well. You know, since I've been a county legislator, you know, Health Alliance in Westchester County Medical Center has gotten, you know, 100, more than \$100 million from the state and other organizations to build up the health care here in Ulster County. And they've used that money to transfer all care from both hospitals to the Broadway campus and now transferring it back to the Mary's Avenue campus, they seem to not be able to know, they seem to not be able to know where they want the hospital be located. They're spending millions and millions of dollars to move it more than once. And all the while, like you say, Mr. Chairman, they're taking away health care from our residents. As someone who sees people, as a first responder sees people in crisis on a daily basis, you know, we need to have these services closer to home, so people can get the help that they need. You know, and, you know, let's call it what it is - Dutchess County has higher reimbursement rates for Medicaid. That's

why they're moving them across the river. It's not because the need is here. It's because if they didn't take them to Kingston hospital, or Benedictine and transferred them across the river to get higher reimbursement rates. That's all it is, all about money not about the people. Thank you Mr. Chairman. I'll be a no as well.

Chairman Donaldson

Thank you. Anyone else on the issue. Legislator Bruno.

Legislator Bruno

Yes Mr. Chairman. I want to reiterate, hopefully what yourself said and Legislator Ronk. I can't with good conscious either give with this legislature give a thin dime to Westchester Medical Center until they give back those beds we desperately need. During this pandemic, the crisis, the opioid addiction and overdoses have gone up tenfold and ignored in the heat of the pandemic when they abandoned us when we needed it the most. We no longer are a community hospital. And as so I can't with good conscious give them money. I'll be a no.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I wholeheartedly agree with all the previous statements. Public health care is is a basic community need. Everybody has right to it. And the fact that Westchester Health Alliance is looking at their bottom line and removed 60 much needed beds for mental health and substance abuse. And then our frontline workers, when the pandemic started to wane, they terminated them. I mean, some of these people had 50 years with the organization. So, I can't either in good conscience, give them any more money. There's other organizations out there that aren't going to be looking at their bottom line, but they're going to be looking at the public service they're providing. So, I'm a no on this resolution.

And I certainly understand that this has to be passed because the care does have to be - the forensic care does have to be done and it would be extremely more expensive. If we went to (inaudible) we would have to be dragging bodies across the river. Not literally but in some ways. But anyway, on the vote please.
