Good evening, I am here tonight representing Friends of Tillson Lake, Inc. a 501c3 not-for-profit incorporated to preserve and protect Tillson Lake in Minnewaska State Park Preserve now and for future generations. I'm here to ask for your help in doing so.

A brief history-

The lake was formed in 1929 when Hassie Tillson constructed a dam on the Palmaghatt Kill to create a recreation area for people from the community and those from outside of the area. He advertised in local and New York City newspapers and the lake flourished. Since then the lake has been a centerpiece of community activity for those living in Gardiner and for Ulster County residents, NY State residents, and visitors from out of the area.

Over its long history the lake has provided a place for those who enjoy fishing, hiking, boating, bird-watching, at one time swimming, roller skating and golf were part of the lake property.

Threatened in recent years by development and changes in private ownership, the lake has survived. Drained in the 80's, it was restored in the 90's to its current state and then, to the relief of all those who use and love the lake, it was acquired by New York State to dramatically enhance the Minnewaska State Park Preserve.

Under the ownership of the Palisades Interstate Parks Commission the Minnewaska Master Plan was updated to include Tillson Lake and the Commission made a commitment to, and I quote:

Initiate the design development of the Tillson Lake Dam

Conduct necessary repairs to Tillson Lake Dam

Improve the Tillson Lake parking area and boat launch.

Tillson Lake was to become an important, vital part of Minnewaska, the only lake in the park to offer fishing, easy access, boating, hiking, and bird-watching in one central location.

The PIPC made some modest improvement to the parking lot, and made minor changes to the boat launch, and since then, nothing. In April of this year, local residents learned in a letter from PIPC that the first major investment the commission was going to make was to secure permits to breach the dam, "dewater" the lake, and have nothing left but the Palmaghatt Kill running through what would be a dry lake bed. They cited the inability to secure the necessary funding to upgrade the dam, a figure they placed first at 7 to 9 million dollars, and then when pressed, Jim Hall the executive director of PIPC produced documentation from 2017 showing a cost of \$2.37 million to a high of \$4.3 million. The cost to dewater the lake and restore what's left hovers at over \$2 million dollars.

It would be a travesty to allow this to happen. Close to a thousand people, those who live in the area, those who grew up here and moved away from the area, and those concerned with the environment have joined FOTL to work and help the PIPC get the funding necessary. It has been a non-partisan effort, getting support from Congressman Faso, Senator Bonacic, Assemblyman Cahill, Executive Hein, and Legislator Bartels, the Town boards of Gardiner and Shawangunk, and advocates in the environmental community.

The ecosystem the lake has developed is both unique and vital, as evidenced by studies commissioned by FOTL from Hudsonia, a respected environmental group, and Karen Schneller-McDonald, an aquatic environment specialist.

If this dam is breached, and the lake drained, there would be incalculable damage to the region,. The loss of property values, the blow to the tax base, the possibility of the release of phosphorous into an already threatened Wallkill River, the impact on the wildlife that live near and use the lake for sustenance, the loss of a high value recreational area in Ulster County, all these should be taken into consideration and balanced against unlikely benefits to bodies of water 45 miles away, separated by 5 dams, including the Hydroelectric Dam at Sturgeon Pool.
