PUBLIC COMMENT: There were (7) seven speakers at tonight's public hearing.

- 1. <u>Jacob Salt</u>: Mr. Salt expressed his support for Energize NY (solar independence), noting it would be a great move for small businesses and feels Ulster County could be a good model for the rest of the state.
- 2. <u>Tory Lowe, Kingston, NY</u>: Ms. Lowe is a member of "Kingston Action for Education", created to combat repeal the Common Core curriculum. Ms. Lowe shared her child's experience and asked for legislative support for this cause. Ms. Lowe felt her children were being abused and consequently enrolled them in private school. They are now achieving success.
- 3. <u>Maria Maritsas, Kingston NY</u>: Ms. Maritsa is a parent, teacher and Co-founder of "Kingston Action for Education" who also spoke to repealing the Common Core curriculum. Ms. Maritsas also shared her children's stressful common core curriculum experiences of being over tested noting, IEP violations of abuse due to testing above a child's comprehension. Children are being tested on current grade level and not their functioning level. Ms. Maritsas feels the states signed onto Common Core sight unseen, solely for financial gain for a race to the top.

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- 4. <u>Jolyn Safron, Hurley NY</u>: Ms. Safron a parent and teacher and a two year advocate, also spoke to repeal the Common Core curriculum. Ms. Safron is also a member of "Kingston Action for Education." Ms. Safron noted 35 percent of 3-5th graders in the Kingston school district did not participate in the current round of testing.
- 5. <u>Madeline Hoetger, Kingston NY</u>: Ms. Hoetger also spoke to repeal the Common Core curriculum. Ms. Hoetger feels the common core for education program was selected by our district because our area is experiencing a huge financial deficit thus welcomed the program incentives to help bring in revenue. She noted Westchester schools and other wealthy areas did not choose to move forward with the program.
- 6. <u>Tim Weidemann, Kingston NY</u>: Mr. Weidemann is Co-Chairman of the not-for-profit Kingston Land Trust Rail Trail Committee in the City of Kingston. Mr. Weidmann thanked everyone for their support noting Legislator Provenzano attended the ground breaking ceremony last Friday. Mr. Weidemann provided posters showing the breath of the project. The City of Kingston has partnered with Iron Horse Preservation Society to remove the ties. For more information on the project go to Kingstongreenline.org
- 7. Gloria Waslyn, Phoenicia NY: Ms. Waslyn shared concerns with the City of Kingston potentially selling water to a bottling company only to ship out to other locations leaving the sludge here in Ulster County. Ms. Waslyn cited we all have a social responsibility to look at how this effects the environment. The stewardship of our community and how it progresses is very important to the Town of Woodstock and many concerned citizens.
