- 1. <u>Dr. Carol Robin, Woodstock</u>: Dr. Robin, an Ulster County resident of 30 years, spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018.
- 2. <u>Jeff Rindler, Exec. Director LGBTQ Community Center, Kingston</u>: Mr. Rindler is a member of the UC Human Rights Commission who spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018 protecting all citizens being discriminated against. Mr. Rindler thanked his fellow Commission members and the Legislature for their work on the law.

- 3. <u>Shari Gold, Woodstock</u>: Ms. Gold is an attorney and member of the UC Human Rights Commission who spoke in support of Proposed Local No. 17 of 2018.
- 4. <u>David Clegg</u>: Mr. Clegg is a private attorney and Chairman of the Human Rights Commission who spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018.
- 5. <u>Marie Elaina</u>: Ms. Elaina, a member of the UC Human Rights Commission, spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018. Ms. Elaina has lived in Ulster County for the past seven years.
- 6. <u>Fran Divine, LGBTQ Board member</u>: Ms. Divine is a PFLAG mom who spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018.
- 7. <u>Fred Mayo, New Paltz</u>: Mr. Mayo has served on the LGBTQ Board for the past eight years and spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018. Mr. Mayo recalled how the community came together and supported the center after the Pulse nightclub shooting in Florida.
- 8. <u>Elana Michelson, Rosendale</u>: Ms. Michelson, a retired SUNY professor, shared her political perspective of government's role in legislating human behavior.
- 9. <u>Penny Coleman, Rosendale</u>: Ms. Coleman shared her experiences of injustice in Ulster County and spoke in support of Proposed Local Law No. 17 of 2018.
