Ms. Mitchell asked for legislative support blocking the Governor from including this in his budget protecting constituent's risk from microwave radiation.

- 4. <u>Michele Hertz, Accord</u>: Ms. Hertz is the founder of Stop Smart Meters New York and President of (NYSUMA), New York Safe Utility Meter Association also opposes the Governor's budget zoning language removing local control allowing 5-G wireless transmitters in our community.
- 5. Larry Roth: Mr. Roth supports reducing our transportation carbon footprint.
- 6. <u>Penny Coleman, Rosendale</u>: Ms. Coleman spoke out against a local company in support of Rise Up Kingston local activist Callie Jayne.
- 7. <u>Philip Guerrier, Kingston</u>: Mr. Guerrier spoke about numerous topics federalist government, cancerous cigarette's, build green, King James, etc.
- 8. <u>Thomas Wanning, New Paltz</u>: Mr. Wanning spoke about income equality/wealth.
