Resolution No. 331: Authorizing The Acquisition Of Real Property Located At 21 O'Neil Street, City Of Kingston, County Of Ulster, For Use As A Child And Family Advocacy Center And Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute, On Behalf Of Ulster County, And And All Documents Required For Said Acquisition – Department Of Public Works (Buildings And Grounds)

Resolution Summary: This resolution authorizes Ulster County to purchase property located at 21 O'Neil St., Kingston, NY in the amount of \$140K from the American National Red Cross for the purpose of UC Child and Family Advocacy Center.

Discussion: Although Ken Crannell was unable to attend he provided the committee with

background information. For over 5 years that the county has rented this facility from the American Red Cross to house our Family and Children's Advocacy Center, which consists of DSS staff, District Attorney Staff, Sheriff, State Police and other law enforcement. This team investigates incidents of child abuse, domestic violence and assault on the elderly. The facility itself is designed to allow us to work with victims in a unique way without adding to their trauma with multiple visits to the hospital and police agencies. The Red Cross is looking to sell the property and given the nature of the services provided there, its location, that the building has been customized to our specifications and is not easily replicated, and that the building is currently off the tax rolls, the decision was made to purchase the building. The purchase price of \$140K is below market value and is federally and state reimbursable.
