Old Business

Legislator Litts confirmed the Chodikee Lake Road structure may possibly be razed September or October of 2018. Commissioner Jackson noted the bidding process has not started yet. Stated previously, the ultimate plan is to raze the structure, use the land as overflow for the nearby rail trail, thus reducing the cost of the Capital Project saving the County an estimated \$350K.

New Business

Legislator Nolan for informational purposes wondered if it was a viable option to include an easement for sidewalks or for shoulder widening, prior to the sale of County tax properties. Deputy County Executive Marc Rider shared liability concerns and possible unintended consequences.

Chairman Fabiano and Marc Rider reminded the committee the Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall will be on full display at Cantine Veterans Memorial Complex in Saugerties from July 18th through July 23rd. Opening ceremonies are on Wednesday 11:00 AM. The traveling memorial is a 5/8 scale replica of the Memorial in Washington D.C.

Chairman Fabiano expressed his gratitude to Commissioner Jackson and staff for a job well done on Fish Creek Road in the Town of Saugerties.

Legislator Nolan expressed residents in Phoenicia were very pleased the County evaluated and removed woody debris collected over time in the Esopus Creek that had settled around the piers of the Woodland Valley Bridge.
