<u>Resolution No. 385</u> - Adopting and Issuing A Negative Declaration Under 6 NYCRR Part 617 State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) By The Ulster County Legislature For The Construction Of A Public Safety Radio Tower and Appurtenances To Be Located At 35 Quarry Road Saugerties New York – Department Of Emergency Services

Resolution Summary: This resolution adopts and issues a negative declaration by the UC Legislature for the construction and all actions associated with the public safety radio tower, located at 35 Quarry Road, Saugerties which include site enclosure, equipment shelter, access road, and electric and data lines together with plans and documents associated with the project and in accordance with the conditions imposed by the Saugerties ZBA in issuing their determination of immunity from the zoning statute under the Monroe Balancing of Public Interest test.

<u>Resolution No. 396</u> - Establishing Capital Project No. 605 - Golden Hill Office Building & Restorative Justice Roof Rehabilitation — Department Of Public Works (Buildings & Grounds)

Resolution Summary: This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 605 for roof rehabilitation on both the Golden Hill Office building 15,198 SF and the Restorative Justice roof rehabilitation 19,900 SF. Solar feasibility studies recommend using cool roof technology designed to reflect more sunlight and absorb less heat than a stand roof which yield significant energy savings through a reduction in cooling load inside the building.

Discussion: Deputy County Executive Marc Rider provided a summary of the feasibility studies for each roof. It was determined they would not be eligible as they are already on the grid for community solar projects which covers 100% of the solar for these buildings. Legislator Greene although extremely appreciative of receiving the analysis/study, expressed the community solar policy needs to be changed at the state level, noting we need to be putting in as much renewable energy infrastructure as is feasible. Committee discussion ensued.
