Resolution No. 366: Establishing Capital Project No. 491 SUNY Ulster – Facilities Master Plan And Amending The 2018-2023 Capital Project Fund – SUNY Ulster

Resolution Summary: This resolution establishes Capital Project No. 491 for SUNY Ulster's Facilities Master Plan – last updated in 2008 which has been determined outdated and in need of revision. It also will amend the 2018-2023 Capital Project Fund. The cost will cover professional services and other fees. \$175K, 50% NYS Dormitory Authority, 50% County. A Bond Resolution will be required.

Discussion:

Chairman Fabiano welcomed and called upon SUNY Ulster Interim VP of Administrative Services John Dunn who provided an overview of Resolution Nos. 366 & 368. Mr. Dunn as Interim VP will oversee Capital Projects, rebuild the HR Dept., and training the new VP. He currently is working in conjunction with the county budget office and planning department moving the Capital Projects forward. The \$31 million comprehensive plan includes new and old monies. The Facilities Master Plan includes an energy audit that includes matching the space to the program requirements - last done in 2008. Priorities include campus wide roof repairs, door and window replacement in Spring of 2019 - bring up to code, save energy.

<u>Resolution No. 359</u>: Amending Capital Project No. 519 – UCLEC Energy Updates To Complete A NYSERDA Flex Tech Energy Study – Department Of Public Works

Resolution Summary: This resolution amends Capital Project No. 519 to conduct a NYSERDA Flex Tech Energy Study creating site-specific targeted analysis to help the County make informed clean energy investment decisions for the Ulster County Law Enforcement Center. The County plans to replace multiple boilers as outlined in the 2018 Capital Program. Amended amount \$31K, A Bond Resolution will be required.

Discussion:

Don Quesnell explained the NYSERDA Flex Tech Study will be a comprehensive energy review for the boilers at the Law Enforcement Center – some are at the end of their useful life. Legislator Greene confirmed it will be a 50/50 funding split for the study.
