Resolutions for the May 16, 2017 Session of the Legislature

Resolution No. 149: Approving The Execution Of A Contract In Excess Of \$50,000.00 Entered Into By The County – CT Male Associates – Department Of Public Works

Resolution Summary: This resolution contract with CT Male Associates provides preliminary design services for the development of a county wide fire training facility.

Discussion:

Chairman Loughran called upon Dennis Doyle who provided an overview and history of this resolution having passed committee last month however referred back to this committee during the April Legislative Session with a reduced scope of services. Phase-1 includes: alternative analysis, data gathering, preliminary design & site plan, environmental, advertising, bid opening and award, elements of detailed design for initial environmental analysis and feasibility. Currently the preferred location selected by the fire service is in the Town of Marbletown on a 51 acre lot owned by Ulster County on Cottekill Road just east of the SUNY Ulster campus. The design work will progress in (2) phases. The project is assumed to be an unlisted action under (SEQRA) and Ulster County will act as the Lead Agency. The anticipated letting date for this project is January 2018, with construction completion by December 2018. The project is currently funded by Ulster County. The County will continue to seek other funding. Cost estimates for Phase-1 for letting scheduled for January 2018 to be \$1,700,000.00. Total design work would cost \$200K. This resolution financial impact for 2017/2018 is \$82.4K. Additional alternative locations will be looked at.

Chairman Loughran called upon Legislative Chairman Kenneth Ronk, Legislator Bartels and the public who all shared information and concerns after attending the Ulster County Fire Training Center Informational meeting on Monday, May 1st at the college. Committee discussion ensued.

Legislator Bartels posed questions to Dennis Doyle and committee members regarding time line for alternative sites, analysis planning and comparison, cost of the Orange County fire training center, and the inability for high capacity water pressure pump operation training at the college. Steve Peterson and Legislator Litts noted pump operation training can be done tanker to tanker or off site wherever there is a body of water such as a pond or the Wallkill or Hudson River. Legislator Bartels confirmed the two acre parcel on the college proper nearest the ball field and in close proximity to residential land was considered but didn't meet the criteria.

Legislator Litts conveyed last month's six page report emailed to the legislature provided background history, comparison of alternative sites considered, criteria, preliminary cost estimates among other information. Legislator Litts stated he does not want the consultant to regurgitate the same report back to the committee. Legislator Litts expressed Ulster County is doing right by the taxpayer by soliciting professionals to determine the facts to make an informed decision as to the best location for the fire training center. Legislator Litts also stated fire training classes have been held at the college in the parking lot, noting Legislator Maloney, Legislator Greene and he spent a day training there and have heard no complaints.

Legislator Greene made the request for all new considered viable sites be included in the task force's matrix, referencing New Paltz as one example, and be open to other criteria such as the availability

of water and sewer. Steve Peterson, Director UC Office of Emergency Mgmt. noted the committee would consider other viable locations once identified and the request made for additional criteria would need to be identified for the committee to consider. Legislator Greene although expressing the need and desire for adequate fire training, noted the Cottekill Road location is not only constrained by portability or mere funding, it's surrounded by residential properties. Legislator Greene confirmed a long form EAF scoping process will take place for public participation/input with Dennis Doyle.

Chairman Kenneth Ronk summarized the discussion by noting after having served on the fire advisory board for eight years prior to becoming Chairman and also served on the sub-committee that looked into the need for a county fire training center, he expressed criteria for any training center is fluid, ever changing and driven by the availability of funds. The committee provided a wish list only, comparable to Orange County's approx. \$4-5 million premier training center as the model. The resolution needs to pass as the next step to identify what Ulster County can afford and if this location makes the most sense. This site is centrally located and provides needed classroom space. Residential locale should not retard growth or progress, and this review will determine if this is the best site.

Mr. Gary Pennock a resident of Stone Ridge provided a document to help the committee visualize potential impacts to the community such as noise, light and other pollutions, etc. The public in attendance are residents who reside in close proximity to SUNY Ulster, Stone Ridge and in whole were opposed to the proposed site location, however all agreed the need to have a training center. They also voiced concern due to the lack of formal notification prior to Monday's informational meeting.

Dennis Doyle plans to meet with the advisory committee to discuss potential preferred alternate sites, pros and cons, development cost, creating a matrix and timeframe, purchase price – affordability being the key criteria. He also noted the advisory committee is the lead agency determining location protocol and expressed it's his understanding SUNY Ulster parcel is their preferred location at this time. Regardless, the county will perform a boundary mapping survey of the college property whether the site is selected or not - \$14K-\$15K.

Chairman Loughran in conclusion confirmed with Dennis Doyle that an alternative site analysis will be done first and then a review of the alternate sites to see if there is a new preferred site. Chairman Loughran thanked everyone for their input and attending the meeting.
