

Proposed Local Law Number 14 Of 2018

County Of Ulster

A Local Law Amending Local Law No. 2 Of 2006 (A Local Law Adopting A County Charter Form Of Government For The County Of Ulster, State Of New York) And Amending Local Law No. 10 Of 2008 (A Local Law Adopting An Administrative Code For The County Of Ulster, State Of New York), To Amend The Term Of Office For Members Of The Ulster County Legislature

BE IT ENACTED, by the County Legislature of the County of Ulster, New York, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section C-8.B of the Ulster County Charter and Section A2-2.B of the Administrative Code are REPEALED and a new Section C-8.B and A2-2.B are added to read as follows:

§ C-8. and § A2-2. Members; terms of office; election.

B. The term of office of the members of the County Legislature shall be four years beginning on the first day of January next following their election at the general election in 2019.

SECTION 2. Mandatory Referendum Question: The question that shall be submitted to the voters is as follows:

Shall the term of office for members of the Ulster County Legislature be changed to four years to standardize the terms of office for all Ulster County Elected Officials?

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

In the event that any portion of this local law is found to be invalid, such finding will not have any effect on either the remaining portions or applications of this local law or any provisions of the Ulster County Charter and Ulster County Administrative Code, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

Pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 23, this Local Law shall not become operative unless and until this Local Law is approved by the duly qualified voters of Ulster County in a manner prescribed by law at the general election on November 6, 2018, and thereafter filed with the Secretary of State.
