New Business

2015 Budget Timeline

Ulster County Attorney Havranek outlined some issues with timeline of the 2015 Budget due to State Legislation S06296/A07947 that extended the authority of Ulster County to impose an additional 1% Sales and Compensating tax. It requires Ulster County to assume all the costs of the Safety Net program in it's approved 2015 Budget. She said that while the County Legislature has passed several resolutions stating their commitment to taking over all Safety Net costs in 2015, S06296/A07947 specifically requires it to be included in the "adopted 2015 County Budget". She warned that if the Legislature followed the usual timeline, there would miss the deadlines required by the New York Department of Taxation for filing.

Attorney Havranek submitted a timeline that would limit the number of days the Legislature usually has to discuss and approve the 2015 Budget. She said that a second alternative would be to ask the state to amend S06296/A07947 to allow Ulster County to request a 10 day notice of waver.

Old Business

Kingston Broadway Corridor Design Plan

Legislator Belfiglio asked Ulster County Planner Doyle about Resolution No. 140 that was approved in the Ways and Means Committee last week. This resolution would approve a contract with VHB Engineering, Surveying and Landscape Architecture PC for up to \$69,090 to create a Kingston Broadway Corridor Design Plan. Ways and Means was told last week that this plan was for the area from Col Chandler Drive thru the intersection with Broadway and Albany Ave. Legislator Belfiglio recalled seeing a plan for that area before and wondered what happened with that plan.

Planner Doyle said Legislator Belfiglio was correct, there is an existing plan for the intersection of Col. Chandler, Broadway and Albany Ave. This new Kingston Broadway Corridor Design Plan proposed in this new contract is for Broadway in Kingston from that intersection to just past the Kingston High School. He reminded the committee that only 5% of the funding is County funding.

Resolution No. 144 and Resolution No. 135

Chairman Gerentine recognized Legislator Manna Jo Green who arrived after the discussion on Resolution No. 144 and asked her for her impressions of the Nevele Casino project after visiting the project today.

Legislator Green began by telling the committee that two megawatts of solar power makes her very, very happy. Most of her questions were answered and felt she could now address the concerns of her constituents. She recognized the Home Rule issues and Ellenville and Wawarsing face their need for the economic benefits this will bring. Legislator Greene was

pleased that the Nevele project was trying to modeling practices of sustainability and felt the developers were receptive to doing more.

Chairman Gerentine then invited Legislator Greene to discuss issues with the County Fleet and Resolution No. 135. He noted that and asked if her questions were answered.

Legislator Greene was disappointed that the cost benefit analysis was not included with the resolution request but trusted that the County Sustainability Policy was followed. She felt that the County needs to be more proactive in moving toward alternatives like electric cars.

Legislator Rodrigues observed that hybrid vehicles are not available on State Bid. As Ulster County and other municipalities gravitate their fleets to a main vehicle perhaps the State could add alternative fuel vehicles to the State bid.

Deputy Executive Crannell said there is also a possibility that alternative energy vehicles are available on other bid proposals like some of the nationwide government bids now available for the County access.

Legislator Greene said that for many years the idea of the benefits of alternative energy vehickes was theoretical. She recently purchased an electric vehicle and has been enjoying 50+ miles/gallon and after charging the vehicle she got over 100 miles/gallon on her trip from Rosendale to the Nevele in Ellenville. She now knows, first hand, that there is also a very real economic benefit to these vehicles. Legislator Greene hopes the Environmental and Energy Committee can take up this issue and create a policy for the County and/or a memorializing resolution to the state to expand the choices available on State Bid.

There being no further business before the Committee, a motion was made by Legislator Rodriguez, seconded by Legislator Provenzano and carried to adjourn the meeting at 6:02 pm.
