Comptroller Gallagher updated the committee on the work of the Quality Analyst and stated 2,400 open contracts in New World have been identified, along with the most often used vendor, contract type, and department. Preschool contracts occur the most frequently with 292 open contracts and the Department of Social Services has the most contracts of any department.

Legislative Chair Bartels requested to include the names of the contracts and noted the value in the cleanup of old contracts but questioned if there was any value in leaving the old contracts open.

Legislator Criswell asked how many open contracts were with RUPCO. Comptroller Gallagher stated that there were 16 open RUPCO contracts but they were all large value contracts.

Legislator Cahill questioned if the analyst would be able to tell if there was any overlap in services. Comptroller Gallagher explained that first, they will exclude the contracts that should be closed, and the scopes will be reviewed and will be able to identify if there an any overlap of services.

Chairman Gavaris asked if the Quality Analyst would be able to assist in creating a template for data to be input in which to quantify the successfulness of a contract. Comptroller Gallagher was agreeable but noted that there would be a few different forms based on different vendors and / or contract types.

Chairman Gavaris asked if there was any old or new business.
