Comptroller Gallagher informed the committee that audit letters have been issued for CARES funding I & II.

Director of Planning Doyle provided a summary of the Housing Action Fund.

Director Doyle explained that this fund is in response to the 2021 Housing Action Plan, where it was recommended to establish a housing fund and establish an advisory group in addition to legislative and executive initiatives.

Director Doyle went on to explain that the Resolution would put the monies into an assigned fund balance, which allows a portion of the county fund balance to be set aside for the purpose of housing and it would carry forward from year to year.

The counties who have instituted similar programs and were reviewed were Tompkins, Dutchess, and Westchester Counties.

Legislators Criswell and Cahill confirmed that the money can be moved out of the assigned fund balance if there is an emergency, or the money is no longer deemed necessary for housing.

Legislator Roberts asked if this money would be utilized for new units or assisting existing units. Director Doyle answered that the primary focus is to provide new units or additional housing opportunities and would not be rental assistance.

Legislator Uchitelle explained that the housing action fund makes this process public and the county is alerting the public to the types of things they're looking to accomplish, all while creating the fund and setting the money aside plus establishing a committee of experts that will provide recommendations to the legislature.

Legislator Cahill questioned the amounts that Tompkins County contributed to the housing opportunities and if the low figures would really make a difference in the potential construction. Deputy County Executive Kelly explained that the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit through Homes and Community Renewal is extremely competitive, and part of the decision-making process includes considering local support.

Director Doyle explained the Housing Smart Communities Initiative, which includes 11 municipalities and 12 actions, which has helped create additional affordable housing units within various housing construction projects.

Legislator Cahill noted that there are discrepancies between Towns in that some do more to take care of the homeless population than others and urged all municipalities to step up. Director Doyle noted that there could be incentives but also disincentives to the Towns that don't participate in Housing Smart Communities or have streamlined zoning.

Legislator Roberts asked what types of housing will be built, noting that individuals may take more pride in ownership in a small house over an apartment complex. Director Doyle suggested the combination of having at least one affordable unit per project, gap financing – for low- and moderate-income individuals, and foresees a mix of private and non-profit owners but does not see the county owning many properties.

Legislator Roberts expressed concern with the suggested makeup of the board.

Legislator Erner asked if there were any restrictions on administrative costs or profits, would the county retain an equity, and could county property transfer to private developers. Director Doyle answered that with legislative action, property can transfer from the county to another entity and felt there was public benefit and therefore equity in the creation of the project and does not require ownership to maintain equity. Director Doyle commented on the significant impact of low- and moderate-income housing projects to those individuals.

Chairman Gavaris asked if there was an estimate for administration costs and Director Doyle explained that there is expected to be ½ FTE, potentially located in the Planning Department. Chairman Gavaris expressed serious disbelief that the job would be only ½ FTE.
