

Creating A Special Committee On The Accessibility Of County-Owned Or Leased Property

Referred to: The Public Works and Capital Projects Committee (Chairman Fabiano and Legislators Maloney, Roberts, Briggs and John Parete)

Legislator Craig Lopez offers the following:

WHEREAS, Section 154 of County Law of the State of New York provides that the Ulster County Legislature may create special committees, and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned State Law requires that any “resolution creating a special committee shall specify the powers and duties of the committee and the number of its members,” and

WHEREAS, inaccessible public buildings and property are contrary to the public’s best interests, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County of Ulster to formally create a special committee for the purpose of evaluating the accessibility of County-owned or leased property; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that a Special Committee of the Ulster County Legislature, consisting of five members of the Legislature is hereby established and set forth and described below:

SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE ACCESSIBILITY OF COUNTY OWNED OR LEASED PROPERTY:

To review County-owned or leased real property or property where County funded programs open to the public operate, to determine the accessibility for those with physical limitations and/or disabilities and make recommendations to the Legislature and County Executive on necessary improvements of the same,

and be it further

RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorize the delegation of any of the powers, duties or responsibilities of the County Legislature or any officer thereof except as otherwise expressly authorized by law,
