The Public Works and Capital Projects Committee (Chairman Loughran and Legislators Decker, Hochberg, Sheeley, Fabiano, Felicello and Roberts) offers the following:

WHEREAS, a Project for Boices Lane @ Morton Boulevard: Boices Lane Repaving Project, PIN 8759.28 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U. S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs of such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 15% State Marchiselli and 5% County, and

WHEREAS, the Project will provide major improvements to the existing road conditions and enhance driving safety, and

WHEREAS, Ulster County desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the costs of preliminary engineering and right-of-way incidental work, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Works requests funds for Boices Lane @ Morton Boulevard, Town of Ulster: Boices Lane Repaving Project, PIN 8759.28 (the "Project"), for the Preliminary Engineering and Right Of Way Incidentals in the amount of \$45,000.00 which is eligible for 80 % Federal and 15% State reimbursements under the Federal Aid Highway and Marchiselli Aid Project Agreement, and

WHEREAS, the project was approved in the 2009 – 2014 Ulster County Capital Program, and pursuant to Resolution No. 351 dated December 3, 2008, and

WHEREAS, the project was approved by the Ulster County Transportation Council in the 2008 – 2012 Transportation Improvement Program, and

WHEREAS, the Public Works and Capital Projects Committee has met and reviewed said request with a majority of the members voting approval, and

WHEREAS, the Ways and Means Committee has met and reviewed said request with a majority of the members voting approval, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Ulster County Legislature hereby authorizes Ulster County to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of preliminary engineering and right-of-way incidental work for the Project or portions thereof, and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$45,000.00 is hereby appropriated and made available to cover the costs of participation in the above phase of the Project, and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Executive of Ulster County be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary Agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or applicable Marchiselli Aid on behalf of Ulster County with the New York Department of Transportation in connection with Boices Lane @ Morton Boulevard, Town of Ulster: Boices Lane Repaving Project, PIN 8759.28 (the "Project"), and the municipality's first instance funding of projects costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and, be it further

RESOLVED, based upon the examination of the Ulster County Legislature, and pursuant to Part 617 of the implementary regulations pertaining to Article 8 of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), it hereby determined that the adoption of this proposed Capital Project constitutes a Type II action as defined under 6 NYCRR 617.5(c) (2) and does not require any determination or procedure under SEQRA, and, be it further

RESOLVED, that Capital Project No. 316 be established for the Boices Lane @ Morton Boulevard, Town of Ulster: Boices Lane Repaying Project, and, be it further
