

Authorizing The Chairman Of The Legislature To Execute An Agreement With The Dutchess County Arts Council For The 2010 Appropriation – Legislature

The Legislative Programs, Education and Community Services Committee (Chairman Harris and Legislators Belfiglio, Hayes, Terrizzi, Donaldson, Gregorius and Madsen) offers the following:

WHEREAS, performing arts are an important component of our cultural heritage, and the many performances arranged by the Dutchess County Arts Council attract the Hudson Valley County residents as well as travelers to see a broad range of entertainment for the community, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 361 dated December 16, 2009, the Ulster County Legislature authorized the Commissioner of Finance to transfer the allocation in the amount of \$41,250.00 to the 2010 Ulster County Budget for the Dutchess County Arts Council 2010 Appropriation, for the purpose of working in partnership with Ulster County to promote the arts and cultural heritage supporting the efforts to promote the County as a destination for cultural tourism, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to County Law Section 224 (13), in order to receive such funds, the Dutchess County Arts Council must submit to the Ulster County Legislature a verified accounting of disbursements to be undertaken, and to the Ulster County Commissioner of Finance, a Memorandum of Receipt signed by the principal officer, and

WHEREAS, the Dutchess County Arts Council will receive payment in the amount of \$41,250.00, in accordance with the terms specified in an agreement with the County of Ulster and the Dutchess County Arts Council and will return any unexpended funds as of December 31, 2010, along with a certified accounting of expenditures to the Commissioner of Finance, and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Programs, Education and Community Services Committee has met and reviewed said request with a majority of the members voting approval, and

WHEREAS, the Budget and Finance Committee has met and reviewed said request with a majority of the members voting approval, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Comptroller and/or any and all officers of the County of Ulster, their agents and representatives, shall be allowed full access upon reasonable notice and at reasonable times to the books, papers, records and premises of the Dutchess County Arts Council, during the period that this resolution is in effect for the purpose of ascertaining the manner in which the above sum of money is being used or applied, and, be it further

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RESOLVED, that the above organization agrees to comply with all applicable Federal, State and local regulations including, in particular, any forbidding discrimination by such organization, and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Ulster County Legislature is hereby authorized to execute an agreement in the amount of \$41,250.00 with the Dutchess County Arts Council, to work in partnership with Ulster County, in the form as filed with the Clerk of the Ulster County Legislature or as modified with the approval of the County Attorney,

and moves its adoption.
