 Resolution Draft No. 0806, August 16, 2011 - Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute An Agreement With The New York State Division Of Criminal Justice Services For The Aid To Defense Program - Department Of Public Defender

Motion offered by Legislator Sweeney, Seconded by Legislator Ronk, All in Favor, Carried.

The purposes of the Aid to Defense Program are to (1) enhance defense services designed to expedite the processing of violent and serious felony cases through the courts, and (2) ensure thorough case processing and effective defense representation. If funding for this program is eliminated, County participation will be reviewed by the Ways and Means Committee.

2. <u>Resolution Draft No. 0807</u>, <u>August 16</u>, <u>2011</u> - Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute An Agreement And Any Amendments To The Agreement With New York State Division Of Criminal Justice Services For The Aid To Prosecution Program (APP) - District Attorney

 Resolution Draft No. 0811, August 16, 2011 - Authorizing The Chairman Of The Ulster County Legislature To Execute An Agreement With The National Railroad Passenger Corporation d/b/a Amtrak To Provide In-Car Communications - Ulster County Sheriff

Motion offered by Legislator Ronk, Seconded by Legislator Sweeney, All in Favor, Carried.

The National Railroad Passenger Corporation d/b/a Amtrak desires an in-car communication system for the purpose of dispatch and data exchange. The Ulster County Sheriff's Office has the capacity to provide this service to vehicles owned and operated by other agencies through its computer server using "packet clusters". It would allow them to run license plates, run criminal histories, criminal warrant checks, jail data base, pistol permits, and would give them GPS capability to see where their vehicles are located. They buy their own equipment and pay the Sheriff's Office for their services and licensing fees.

The Ulster County Board of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES) has requested a Deputy Sheriff be assigned as a School Resource Officer at the BOCES building located in Port Ewen. BOCES will reimburse Ulster County 100% of the salary plus benefits of the Deputy Sheriff assigned as the School Resource Officer.
