<u>SUNY Ulster Update</u>: President Dr. Alan Roberts and VP of Administrative Services Jamie Capuano provided their monthly update, enrollment, CARES funding, waiver federal funding timeline, mask requirement due to delta variant – proof of vaccination vs. testing, mandate requirement for all onsite students once vaccine is FDA approved. Legislator Criswell inquired and spoke to the proposed pilot program partnered with Ellenville Regional Hospital. Committee discussion ensued.

## **Resolutions for August 17, 2021 Session:**

**Resolution No. 352** – Amending The 2021 Ulster County Budget To Include Additional Funding From The New York State Office For The Aging - Office For The Aging

**Resolution Summary:** This resolution amends the 2021 UC Budget to include additional funding to allocate Federal stimulus funding provided through the American Rescue Plan in the amount of \$142K to be used for any eligible services to assist UC senior citizens; and once the Major Disaster Declaration is lifted, the allowable services under the corresponding parts of the Older Americans Act Title III funding. Funding may be used from 4/1/21 - 9/30/24.
