Resolution No. 452 – Establishing A Policy Requiring Evaluation Of Surplus Or Idle County-Owned Real Property For Tiny Home Developments To Support Unhoused Persons

Resolution Summary: This Resolution establishes a Policy requiring that all surplus or idle real property owned by Ulster County be evaluated for its suitability for tiny home developments intended for the use and occupancy of unhoused residents of Ulster County, with a priority on addressing the needs of unhoused Ulster County veterans. This Resolution further directs the Director of Planning to develop a process to assess the feasibility of such developments, including site suitability, infrastructure needs, compliance with local zoning and building codes, the availability of grant funding from federal, state, and local sources and public-private partnerships with nonprofit organizations to minimize fiscal impacts and support the development and operation of tiny home communities.

Resolution No. 453 – Setting Minimum Habitability Standards For Emergency Housing Contracts And Establishing A Policy Requiring Transportation Access For Emergency Housing Facilities In Ulster County

Resolution Summary: This Resolution establishes Minimum Habitability Standards that must be included as contract terms binding any facility or provider that contracts with the Ulster County Department of Social Services for emergency housing placements, and requires that such contract terms include, at a minimum, requirements pertaining to clean linens, regular pest control, safe drinking water, the completion of necessary repairs, and required disclosures upon placement. This Resolution further requires the Department of Social Services conduct inspections of contracted emergency housing facilities at least once per quarter to verify compliance with these standards.

Resolution No. 275 - Amending Resolution No. 275 Of 2014 As Amended, Establishing A Policy For A "Rail With Trail" Along The County-Owned Ulster And Delaware Railroad Corridor

Resolution Summary: This Resolution Amends the "Rail with Trail" Policy to extend rail use as described therein, and to extend the Ashokan Rail Trail East in the direction of the City of Kingston to connect to the extended operating permit area, and at the point of connection, stating that Rail with Trail should co-exist, and designating a use to the Undesignated Section as stated therein.
